REPORT OF COUNCIL

President's report

The year 2005 can be seen as a year of relative calm for the profession. ICAB has supported the International Accounting and Auditing Standards Board ("IAASB") in their efforts to develop a parallel set of accounting standards for small and medium- sized enterprises ("SMEs") as we see this as having a significant impact on companies in the Caribbean. By definition an SME is a small enterprise which has no public interest. Within the Caribbean there exists an overwhelming majority of such entities that are not listed on stock exchanges nor are of any predominant public interest. Other than size, therefore, most of Caribbean business can be defined as SMEs and should welcome changes that simplify their financial reporting.

Our members in public practice have continuous challenges keeping up to date and ensuring that the financial statements they audit are presented in accordance with an increasingly complicated set of International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") and members in industry constantly push back on the need for full adoption of IFRS by ICAB as the local standard. I believe that as a profession we should maintain the highest standards at all times and therefore have always supported the full adoption of IFRS as is the case for all members of the International Federation of Accountants ("IFAC"). Once IFRS for SMEs becomes a reality we will also support it as Barbados needs to be leaders in everything we do if this country is to maintain its place at the world's economic table.

In June 2006 we mark our twenty-fifth anniversary of IFAC membership and we shall be hosting the ICAC annual conference at the Hilton from the 8th to 10th. We are also fortunate to have the current president speaking at the conference and sharing in the anniversary. In addition, we have secured the presence of the vice chairman of the International Accounting Standards Board who is an active member of the emerging issues Task Force who will be here in the Caribbean to speak on the status of the SME project.

The ongoing issue of limited liability for public practitioners and our inability to discipline members remains unresolved but changes to the legislation have been drafted and your council has provided Government with our comments. We remain hopeful that resolution of these matters will be forthcoming.

We remain committed to strengthening our profession and to that end we continue to support the negotiations with the Inter-American Development Bank ("IADB"), through the Institute of Chartered Accountants of the Caribbean, to secure donor funding.

FINANCES

This year, the Institute recorded a surplus of \$43,523 (2004 – \$88,848). The highlights for the year were: -

- General Fund increased by 14% to \$354,734 (2004 – increase by 40%) due to surplus generated during the year.
- Cash, term deposits and investments increased to \$329,607 (2004 - \$319,048) as profits were realised in cash for the most part.
- Accounts payable and accruals decreased by \$20,002 (2004 – increase of \$22,408) as a result of some costs of CPE activities which were accrued in the prior year being settled during this year.
- Total revenue was \$283,959 (2004 – \$345,365), a decline due primarily to a fall back in CPE profits.
- Cost of operations totalled \$240,436 (2004 – \$256,517) a decline resulting from not having any bad debts for this year nor the dinner for the 30th anniversary as was the case in 2004.

Budget and plans for 2006

Council has approved a Budget for 2006, which projects total revenue of \$295,000 (2005 actual – \$278,201) and operating expenses of \$246,400 (2005 actual – \$240,436) leaving a net surplus of \$48,600 (2005 actual – \$37,765). We continue to plan for increased CPE activity as our main profit line and the strategy of sharing seminars with ACCA & BIBA will continue as these alliances proved themselves financially during 2005.

Council is pleased to report that the costs of operation for the year were maintained within budget, however, the expected revenue from CPE activity did not materialise and the resulting surplus was less than anticipated. Again this year it is expected that Institute activities can be maintained without any rate increases in subscriptions.

The demand for time and effort being placed on council members who have volunteered their services is becoming significant and we anticipate a need to hire a senior executive resource in order to strengthen the secretariat. Once IADB funding becomes available we expect to reconsider the employment of a chief operating officer.

The level of capital expenditure being budgeted for 2006 is consistent with the amount spent in prior years.

Rueben Blenman and Carol Nicholls have indicated their willingness to seek re-election and on behalf of Council and the members of the Institute we extend our thanks and appreciation for the efforts put in by all members who have been able to serve on council.

Special mention needs to be made of Elson Jordan's contribution, however, as he retires having served as president and completed in excess of ten years service to council. Elson's term also included two years as the ICAC president and we wish him all the best in his future challenges.

ICAB ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Institute continues with its commitment to the furtherance of the relationship between the UWI and the profession in general, and for the seventh consecutive year, has awarded a scholarship, valued at \$2,500, to a student pursuing a first degree in accounting, based on performance in the academic year commencing in 2005.

The recipient of this award is Ms. Astrid Arthur and the award was presented by vice president Patrick Hinkson at a Cave Hill Campus ceremony on April 4, 2006.

COMMITTEES REPORTS

STANDING COMMITTEES

Investigations, Disciplinary, Appeals and Ethics Committees

ACCOUNTING & AUDITING STANDARDS



Chairman – Andrew Brathwaite

International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS)

Changes under the IASB's Improvements Project, including revisions to 13 International Accounting Standards, took effect for December 31, 2005 year ends. These revisions were covered in a joint ICAB/ACCA seminar held in September 2005, and the published text of each revised standard now includes an introduction which summarizes the changes and any new requirements. A number of other new standards (IFRS 1, 4 and 5) also came into effect for December 31, 2005 year ends. At least 2 other new IFRS's have already been issued and come into effect after 2005, and we are expecting a number of new standards and exposure drafts to be published during 2006. These publications reflect the IASB's continuing efforts towards convergence with other major standard setting bodies and global acceptance of IFRS.

Financial Reporting by Small and Medium-Sized Entities

During the year we continued to monitor the IASB's "Financial Reporting by Small and Medium-Sized Entities (SMEs)" project. A presentation was made at the 2005 Annual Conference outlining various IASB proposals, following which comments were solicited from members. These comments were collated and feedback provided to the IASB.

An exposure draft with the proposed new standards is already under review by the IASB, and should be published sometime in 2006. Final standards are expected to be published in 2007. As has been noted in prior years, Council views these SME standards as an important development, and will continue to participate in their formulation wherever possible.



ACCOUNTING & AUDITING STANDARDS (continued)

Online access to International Financial Reporting Standards

Since the publication of the 2004 International Financial Reporting Standards volume, Council has been encouraging members to subscribe for online access to the standards (eIFRSs) rather than purchasing the traditional bound volumes. It was felt that eIFRSs are the preferred option given, among other things, the rapid publication of new standards and interpretations, and the availability of various online research aids and tools.

After an initially favourable response from members, interest in the online subscription has declined substantially. This has no doubt been compounded by a number of technical problems experienced by the IASB in providing the service and providing the necessary support.

Based on these factors, we have decided to temporarily discontinue provision of the online subscription and will be taking orders for the bound volume of the 2006 International Financial Reporting Standards which became available in March this year. Members may of course contact the IASB directly to subscribe to eIFRS or purchase other IASB products.

Other activities

The Committee considered a proposal for a Caribbean scheme to monitor practising accountants, and comments and a request for further information and clarification has been submitted to ICAC. During 2005 the Committee alerted practising members to new requirements included in IFAC's 2005 Handbook of International Auditing, Assurance and Ethics Pronouncements.

LEGISLATION



Chairman – Marlon Yarde

During the year the legislation committee did not meet and there is no report.



ADVISORY



Chairman – Betty Brathwaite

The committee, through its chairman, has continued with its work with the Barbados Coalition of Service Industries Inc (“BCSI”) as the BCSI continues on its mandate to promote the further development and competitiveness of the Barbados services’ sector. ICAB supports the view expressed by the Government of Barbados that the development of the services sector is crucial to the future development of the economy of Barbados and encourages all members to support the work of the BCSI. The committee is currently engaged in the review of a draft CARICOM Financial Services Agreement which seeks to promote the enactment of harmonised provisions in the law to govern the financial services sectors in CARICOM.

COMMUNICATIONS



Chairman – Michael Carrington

The members of the communications committee were solicited late in the year and held informal discussions on their mandate and improving the image of ICAB. With Council’s approval, the committee retained a professional firm to redevelop and enhance the web site to service members and students and provide a wealth of information to prospective students and interested parties.

Future plans for the website includes indexing to the database of member’s information, secured transactions and links to several regional and international institutions and local legislation.



CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION



Chairman – Rueben Blenman

Given the need to continue our compliance with the International Federation of Accountants (IFAC) requirements for continuing professional education (CPE) the committee has offered members seminars during the year that are designed to provide a wide range of professional development opportunity. CPE activity for the year provided members with the opportunity to earn 42 hours (2004 – 49 hours) of structured CPE activities.



The following topics were covered at the seminars:

- Forensic Auditing – 6hrs
- International Financial Services – 6hrs
- SME Challenges – 6hrs
- Investment Decision making methods – 6hrs
- Update on International Financial Reporting Standards – 6hrs
- 3rd Annual Captive Insurance Workshop – 6hrs

In addition, this year's Annual Conference had as its theme this year "**Changing Roles in a Global Economy**". The guest speaker was a past president, Chris deCaires, and there was something for everyone as the program covered topics ranging from the National Initiative for Service Excellence, an update on the occupational Health and Safety legislation, effective communication and the changing role of accountants from the books to the boardroom.

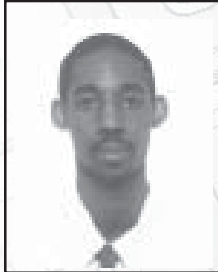


The increased number of seminars during the year, coupled with quite favourable attendance, resulted in a net contribution, including the annual conference, of \$30,359 (2004 - \$87,027) to the surplus of the Institute. This represents 80.4% (2004 – 98.0%) of the surplus for the year.

STUDENT & MEMBER SERVICES

The Committee for the current year commenced its duties in June 2005 and immediately set about the task of clarifying its terms of reference and role and functions expected of it. One of key functions of continuously creating added value to students and members alike is without doubt not a simple task and for the first six months the Committee focused its attention on assessing and creating areas or benefits that would be useful to each student and member. To this end, the results of a survey conducted a few years ago are currently being reviewed and considered.

One of the major decisions taken so far has been to strive to ensure that cooperation exists between this Committee and the Communications Committee in delivering information, feedback and support to students and members. The provision of support, guidance and information on an ongoing and timely basis has been identified as one the primary methods by which the Institute can add value to its membership.

There still remains significant work to be carried out in all student and member related matters, however for there to be success, we require your thoughts and feedback as students and members as you determine where the Committee could assist the Institute in meeting your professional needs. In an effort to reach out to new students the Institute participated in the professional careers workshop for high school students held at the Dove Convention centre.

Over the next few months the Committee has been charged with development of a series of activities, especially of a social nature to encourage a greater interaction among members and awareness of ICAB and its role. This effort should continue from where the Cocktail Reception and Presentation commenced in December 2005. Additionally, many of our initiatives for adding value will be communicated via our website.





MEMBERSHIP



Chairman –Jefferson Hunte

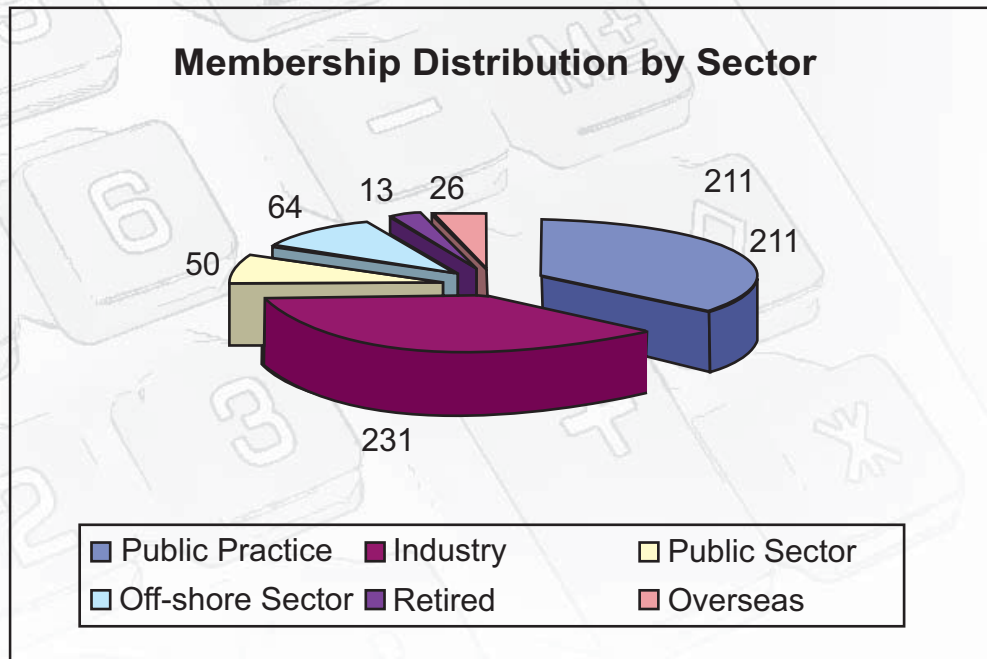
During 2005 the institute's overall membership remained relatively consistent, increasing by a net amount of 3 members (2004 - 20). The two main traditional sectors of employment, public practice and industry, continue to account for a combined 74% (2004 – 74%) of total membership. The marginal net increase in membership was a direct result of the delisting of 20 members during the year for non-payment of the annual subscriptions, despite the persistent and time consuming efforts by the Secretariat to encourage members to finalize payment by the due date.

TASK FORCE ON LIMITED LIABILITY



Chairman – Brian Robinson

During the year the draft legislative changes were reviewed and commented on by council as we continue to work with the Ministry of International Business. The first step is the change to the companies act to allow the use of structures for the limitation of liability. Once completed the legislation allowing use of limited liability partnerships (“LLP”) will be drafted. The issue of ICAB’s ability to discipline members remains outstanding and seems a casualty of Government’s scarce drafting resources.

ICAC MATTERS



Alternate Director – Betty Brathwaite

ICAC changed its president by rotation at its directors meeting in Belize in June and incoming president from Jamaica, Mr. Garth Kiddeo, immediately set plans in motion for a strategic planning session which was held in Barbados on October 1, 2005.

ICAB’s responsibility lies in the Chair of the Membership Committee and in that capacity your directors have been relentless in the efforts to encourage Jamaica to recognise CGA as an acceptable approved accrediting body with ICAJ. This was achieved by the verbal representative of Jamaica at the Board meeting held in Barbados on January 28, 2006.

In addition Barbados has been driving the ICAC negotiations with regards to the Multilateral Investment Fund (“MIF”), Inter-American Development Bank (“IADB”) funding for strengthening the Institutes in the Caribbean. The full Barbados position is disclosed in the ICAB 2004 annual report. The update for 2005 is that the IDB has agreed to group Barbados, Guyana, Belize and the Bahamas into one fund with Barbados as the lead. The delay in implementation has been Guyana’s inability to source the counterpart funding component which is required in cash. The Institutes have stuck together and indicated that Guyana must be a part of the fund and within the IDB funding is being sought for that component for Guyana. This is great news and as a result it is expected that within a short period of time the necessary funding will be made available.

TAXATION

1 Incorporation

The Institute was established under the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Barbados (Incorporation) Act, 1974. Its objects are inter alia to promote, foster and maintain the highest standard of accounting in public practice, the public service and the commercial and industrial spheres.

2 Accounting policies

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards, which comprise standards and interpretations approved by the International Accounting Standards Board, and International Accounting Standards and Standing Interpretations Committee interpretations approved by the International Accounting Standards Committee that remain in effect. Significant accounting policies are as follows:

a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention except for the measurement at fair value of mutual fund investments.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with International Financial Reporting Standards requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

b) Depreciation and amortisation

Depreciation of furniture and equipment is provided on the straight-line method at rates designed to write off the assets over their estimated useful lives, which range from 3 to 8 years. Leasehold improvements are amortised over their useful lives or the period of the lease if shorter.

c) Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable are carried at original invoice amounts less an estimate made for doubtful receivables based on a review of all outstanding amounts at year end. Bad debts are written off when identified.

d) Revenue recognition

Annual subscriptions and admission fees are recorded when due. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis.

2 Accounting policies ...continued

a) Investments

The Institute's Council determines the appropriate classification of its investment at the time of purchase, and evaluates such designations at the balance sheet date. With the exception of term deposits, all of the Institute's investments are in mutual funds and have been designated at fair value through profit and loss. These investments are intended to be held for an indefinite period of time, and may be sold in response to need for liquidity or changes in interest rates, exchange rates or equity prices. In prior years the mutual fund investments were classified as available-for-sale.

All investments are initially recognised at cost. Mutual fund investments are subsequently re-measured at fair value and changes in fair value are recognised in the statement of income. Fair value is determined as the net asset value quoted by the Fund Manager. Investment transactions are recorded on the trade date.

Term deposits are valued at the amount of principal outstanding.

Unrealised changes in market value of investments held at the year end are reflected in the Statement of Income and Expenditure. Interest income is accrued as earned.

11 Pension plan

The Institute operates a defined contribution pension plan which commenced on January 1, 1997. Contributions to the plan are determined by an independent qualified actuary. Members of the plan contribute 2% of their pensionable salary below the NIS maximum plus 5% of any salary in excess of this maximum to the pension plan. The Institute contributes to the plan at the rate of 2.24% per annum of total pensionable salary.

The assets of this plan are held separately from those of the Institute and are invested and managed by its Trustees. Contributions to the plan are charged to income. Contributions for the year amounted to \$1,330 (2004 – \$1,584) so as to spread the cost of pensions over the service lives of employees.

At year end, the market value of the assets of the plan was \$ 19,679 (2004 – \$29,205).

12 Financial instruments

Fair value

The fair values of cash, term deposits, accounts receivable, and of accounts payable and accruals are not materially different from their carrying values on the balance sheet.

Mutual fund investments are carried on the balance sheet at fair value.

Fair value estimates are made at a specific point in time, based on market conditions and information about the financial instrument. These estimates are subjective in nature and involve uncertainties and matters of significant judgement and therefore, cannot be determined with precision. Changes in assumptions could significantly affect the estimates.

Credit risk

Cash, term deposits and investments are placed with reputable banks and financial institutions.

The Institute provides services and sells products to its members and/or customers primarily in Barbados. The Institute performs ongoing credit reviews of its members and/or customers and generally does not require collateral. A provision for uncollectible amounts is provided if deemed necessary.

Interest rate risk

The Institute does not have any significant exposure to interest rate risk.
